### ***Brains for Brain***

Brains for Brain is a newly founded European Task Force on Brain and Neurodegenerative Lysosomal Storage Diseases, led by Dr Maurizio Scarpa, University of Padova and Dr David Begley, King's College London. The initiative was conceived at a workshop in Madrid, March 2007 focusing on addressing current problems of overcoming the blood brain barrier to deliver therapy for LSDs.

The mission of Brains for Brain is to catalyse research in the field of neurodegeneration and lysosomal diseases. Brains for Brain is formed as an association of highly distinguished scientists and clinicians working together to create and coordinate effort towards the comprehension of the pathophysiology processes of neurological disorders occurring in lysosomal storage disorders. The implementation of knowledge of blood brain barrier function and the development of new molecular and or biochemical strategies to overcome the blood brain barrier and treat neurological disorders is a central part of the effort.

The achievement of these targets will allow the development of new approaches for therapy of the neurological complications of LSDs patients. ## ***Update on Requests for Proposals from GOLD member organisations.***

Requests for proposals from 3 member organisations were announced in the last Update, and posted on the GOLD website. The UK Gaucher Association, The National Tay Sachs and Allied Diseases Association and The Canadian MPS Society were extremely impressed with the quality of the research proposals they received. The awards made were:

**The UK Gaucher Association** awarded a grant to Professor Mia Horowitz, Dept Cell Research and Immunology, Tel Aviv University, Ramat Aviv, Israel. This is for a 3 years study, 15 hours a week.

Purpose of the project:

- To test the correlation between endo-H sensitivity in different cell types and neuronopathic Gaucher disease severity.
- To identify interactors of mutant glucocerebrosidase variants, that participate in its ERAD.
- To test whether ER stress caused to brain cells in patients with type 2 or 3 Gaucher disease leads to their death through apoptosis or autophagy

**The National Tay Sachs and Allied Diseases Association 2007 Research Initiative** awarded two grants. Recipients are:

4. \$40,000.00 grant to Dr. Murray Potter, University of Western Ontario, London, Ontario for MPS II Blood Brain Barrier Research.

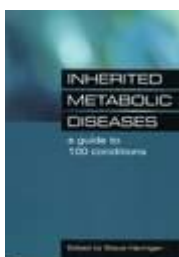

## ***Multidimensional Clinical Assessment Tool for Batten Disease***

Children and young people with Batten Disease, in the UK, are invited to participate in a project aiming to develop a clinical assessment schedule to monitor symptoms and disease progression. Participants will be asked to attend 4 six monthly assessments over a 2 year period either at the Evelina Children's Hospital in London or at a more convenient local centre or school. Assessments are expected to take between 60 and 90 minutes each. They will consist of a clinical neurological and developmental examination together with a short audio recording of speech in some cases.
